Jim received his elementary education in Vernon #6 Country School and then attended Milbank Schools, graduating with the MHS class of 1959. Following one year at SDSU, he returned to join his father in farming. Later, he was happy to welcome his eldest son, Eric, to the operation.

On July 11, 1962, Jim was united in marriage with Nancy Feind. After 11 years on the home farm, the couple moved to a farm by LaBolt where the couple resided at the time of his death. His occupation was farming, his hobby was farming, and his favorite leisure time activity was resting on Sunday for the next six days of farming. Dubbed "Mr. Fix It" by his mother, Jim could fix almost anything: often with not much more than determination, patience, and something from his vast unorganized shed where he stored "things he might need someday."
