Lydia graduated from Graceville High School in 1967.

Following graduation, Lydia worked at the Clinton Nursing Home as a Nurse Assistant. She helped care for her father, who had been diagnosed with cancer, until he passed away in 1968. This experience fostered her desire to pursue a career in caring for others. In 1969, she attended Alexandria Area Vocational and Technical School and became a Licensed Practical Nurse.
