R uth Eleanor Starr Anderson Modin was born on August 30, 1921, in Tower City, ND. She was the daughter of Edward Peter Starr and Caroline Marguerite Schmitz Starr. She was baptized and was a member of the Presbyterian Church of Tower City. Ruth attended grade school and graduated from Tower City High School in 1939. After high school, Ruth attended Valley City State Teacher's College in Valley City, ND, graduating in 1941 with a Standard Diploma Certification in the Teacher Training Curriculum and Music.
